





कबीरदास

कबीरदास का जीवन परिचय: भक्तिकाल को हिंदी का स्वर्ण युग कहा जाता है। भक्तिकाल के संत कवियों में संत कबीरदास का स्थान सबसे ऊपर माना जाता है। कबीरदास १५वीं शताब्दी के महान संत, कवि और समाज सुधारक थे। उनका जन्म १३९८ ईस्वी में काशी (वाराणसी) में हुआ था। उन्होंने समाज में प्रचलित अंधविश्वासों, पाखंड और जाति-धर्म के भेदभाव का विरोध किया। कबीरदास ने अपने दोहों, साखियों और रमैणियों के माध्यम से

सरल भाषा में प्रेम, समानता और एकता का संदेश दिया। उनकी रचनाएँ गुरु ग्रंथ साहिब में भी शामिल हैं और उनकी शिक्षाओं से प्रेरित कबीर पंथ आज भी उनके विचारों का प्रसार करता है। वे भक्तिकाल के अकेले ऐसे संत थे जिन्होंने अपनी लेखनी के दम पर समाज को सुधारने की कोशिश की। वो जब तक जिन्दा रहे, उन्होंने समाज के द्वारा बनाई गई कुरीतियों के खिलाफ आवाज उठाई। कबीर दास की रचनाएँ पढ़कर अंदाजा लगाया जा सकता है कि वे अपने समय से कितने आगे का सोचते होंगे।

कबीरदास के कुछ प्रसिद्ध दोहे (अर्थ सहित):

बुरा जो देखन मैं चला, बुरा न मिलिया कोय । जो दिल खोजा आपना, मुझसे बुरा न कोय ॥

अर्थ: कबीर कहते हैं कि जब मैं इस दुनिया में बुराई खोजने गया, तो मुझे कुछ भी बुरा नहीं मिला और जब मैंने खुद के अंदर झांका तो मुझे खुद से ज्यादा बुरा कोई इंसान नहीं मिला।



In contrast, China provides quick approvals and easy policies for businesses. India has taken steps like the 'Make in India' and 'Ease of Doing Business' initiatives, but further simplification is needed. For example, Tesla wanted to set up a factory in India but faced delays due to complex regulations.
- 4. Focus Skilled Workforce: China invests heavily in technical education, while India lacks enough skilled workers. Increasing vocational training and industry partnerships can help. For example, Germany's dual education system trains students in classrooms & factories, making them job-ready. India should adopt a similar model.
- 5. Strong Local Supply Chains: India depends on Chinese parts for manufacturing. Developing local suppliers can reduce this reliance. During COVID-19, Indian businesses struggled due to supply chain disruptions in China. TATA & Reliance are investing in semiconductor manufacturing, which is a good step.

- 6. Attracting Foreign Companies: Many global companies want to move out of China due to rising costs & political issues. India can attract them by offering tax breaks & fast approvals. For example, Vietnam attracted Samsung with special incentives. India can do the same for companies like Tesla & Intel.
- 7. Investing in Innovation: China spends heavily on research and development (R&D) to build high-tech industries. India must do the same to compete in fields like robotics, electric vehicles & A.
